Forest School

I am pleased to announce that Miss McBeath is in her final stages of becoming a Forest School leader. **Forest School** is based on a Scandinavian concept that offers opportunities for holistic growth, through regular sessions throughout the year in the outdoor environment, preferably a woodland area. The ethos focuses on child-centred learning styles that maximise the emotional, social and developmental benefits. It helps children become successful learners and confident individuals that also learn to care for their local and wider environment, and understand their place in maintaining and preserving the natural world around them. It is designed to enhance and complement mainstream education, offering a valuable, alternative curriculum in an outdoor environment. It is inclusive of all learning abilities, in a non-judgemental, nurturing way, proven to help learners develop socially, emotionally, physically and intellectually.

As you know, we have worked hard to embrace and develop outdoor learning at Tarves and this has significant positive impact on pupil wellbeing. Moving forward, every class will participate in child-led, Forest School activities, with Miss McBeath on a rota basis, including den building, mindfulness, insect identification and the introduction of using fire and tools, where appropriate, under controlled surroundings.

We are lucky to have access to a range of Forest School sites within the village and will be using these throughout the year in addition to our own playground area. Attached to this newsletter is a flyer from Miss McBeath; if you are having a Summer clear-out, there are a list of items we would be more than happy to take!

We are very excited to be able to offer this amazing opportunity to our pupils. This is supported by an allocated amount of 'Covid Recovery' money from the Scottish Government, ensuring every child benefits.



Primary 4 Free School Meals

The Scottish Government have announced that Free School Meals will be extended to all Primary 4 pupils next year. If your child will be in Primary 4, you do not need to do anything, other than be aware a school meal will be provided. You are also welcome to send your child in with a packed lunch instead, should they/you prefer.

The Scottish Government aim is that by January 2022, Primary 5 children will also be receiving FSM with Primary 6 and Primary 7 by August 2022.
