
## **Plea for volunteers/coaches for next academic year**





## Virtual Nature School - Nursery

I am thrilled to announce that the Nursery team have just completed a course on outdoor learning with the *Virtual Nature School*. The focus was on "looking" outside, with the children discussing what they found and deciding what they would like to learn about in more detail over a 6-week period.

- looking under





Vikki and Michelle write about the experience:

*Each week we used these words, watched provocation videos, discussed what these meant and what we would like to learn about and then recorded all our learning in a floor-book. Each day we would learn new things that sometimes led us to asking more questions, leading us to have to research the answers.*

*At the end of the 6 weeks, we had completed a 44-page floor-book full of learning, all across the curriculum after taking part in sky collages, measuring spider webs, exploring flowers, roots and absorption, transient art, making tracks and patterns, colour mixing, bird watching and nest making.*

*We found it a rewarding and valuable experience for the staff and an engaging, thought-provoking project for the children. They really enjoyed making their voice heard in their learning journey through the Virtual Nature School.*



*We have used the floor-book system very successfully, showing the children's learning, recording it in an effective way and how to revisit and embed the learning that has taken place. We will continue to use the floor-books for our future learning interests. We have also discovered the flexibility potential in our learning activities, there are many things that we can do outside that we might previously have thought were best done indoors.*

Well done to the Nursery team! What an incredible achievement and wonderful learning experience for the children.
