Dear Parents/Carers,

## A word from Mrs Conn

We have had a very busy start to the term with Forest School sessions well underway for all classes. After school clubs have started with support from our parent volunteers in liaison with Active Schools (more information on clubs at Tarves and within the Meldrum Cluster, and how to sign up, is below in this letter). A big thank you to everyone who is giving up their time to support us with these sessions and clubs, it is very much appreciated; we couldn't do it without your help.

There is some congestion at the front of the school, mainly at home collection time, but also in the morning. We have staff on the playground to ensure the children are supervised first thing; there is no reason for parents/carers to stay, under the current circumstances. This will change once the restrictions for schools are lifted, hopefully in the next few weeks. There are also some adults standing directly at the entrance/exit gate to the front of the school which means that parents/carers, children and members of the local community have had to step on to the road to get past. Please can we ask that you are mindful of those around you at this busy time and appreciate your cooperation in this matter.

We know things are not quite back to the sense of 'normal' we once had, however, we will continue to, working within our restrictions, involve parents/carers as much as practically possible in any school activities and events. We will be having a Parent/Carer Consultation session in November and more details will follow. As a school, we are prioritising reading and comprehension activities for home, as these are the vehicle to accessing the whole curriculum. Your son/daughter will be bringing a book home with them, should they not have one already, please read as much as possible. Primary 1 will be accessing Phonics on Google Classroom, as arranged with Mrs Anderson and Mrs Joyce. We will be reviewing homework, as appropriate, and further information will be communicated in due course. As you can appreciate, we are working hard to address the challenges to ensure the children are 'back on track' after a significant period of time away from school.

## Warn and Inform Letters

You may or may not have received a 'Warn and Inform' letter, either from us or if you have older children at the academy, if there has been a confirmed, positive case of Covid-19 in your child's class. These are standardised letters sent to inform you of what to do or expect in the event your son/daughter develops classic Covid-19 symptoms or extended symptoms.

Please do not panic or worry! Receiving this letter does not mean your child has Covid-19 or that you will be contacted by Test and Protect. All we would ask is that you follow the guidance on the letter and please call us if you have any queries. We will do our best to point you in the right direction or advise. A reminder that the Scottish legislation differs to that of England, so do be mindful of this if you are searching for information online.
